Stitches, suturing, stapling
Vomiting
Wound infection

Emergency Room

Chest pain
Coughing up blood
Fever in infants under 3 months old
Fever with rash
Head or eye injuries
Heart attack or stroke
One-sided weakness or numbness
Poison ingestion
Seizures
Serious or severe injuries, burns or shocks
Severe abdominal pain
Severe bleeding or large open wounds
Severe fractures or broken bones
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
Sudden blurred vision or loss of vision
Unconsciousness
Vaginal bleeding with pregnancy
